# Program Overview

- Support coordination between Healthy Homes Production (HHP) and Weatherization Assistance Program (WAP) to maximize program efficiencies and reduce WAP deferrals.
- Demonstrate sustainable models of inter-program cooperation, including data-sharing and reporting, and create the opportunity to improve health outcomes by supporting data collection and evaluation.
- Promote sustainable financing of coordinated healthy homes and weatherization interventions.

## Available Funding

- \$9M available funding
- Minimum award: \$1M
- Maximum award: \$1M
- Period of Performance: 36-months (3 years) Project and Budget Periods

## Eligible Applicants



- State, County, City, Tribal, and Local Governments
- Nonprofits with 501(c)(3) status
- U.S. territories and possessions

## Ineligible Applicants



- Individuals
- Federal Agencies
- Native American tribal organizations other than Federally recognized Tribal governments
- Organizations with an active HUD HHWCD grant



# Program-Specific Requirements

Grantees must:

- Demonstrate strategies for coordination between HUD's HHP and DOE's WAP programs to maximize efficiencies and benefits to occupants
- Reduce WAP deferrals through coordination with HHP programs







# Program-Specific Requirements

- Conduct coordinated interventions in 15 units without using funds from HHWCD except for costs related to program evaluation activities
- Grantees will be required to conduct coordinated HHP/WAP interventions in 40 units
- Demonstrate sustainable models of inter-program cooperation
- Demonstrate models for the sustainable financing of healthy homes/weatherization interventions
- Data collection to evaluate housing interventions




# Funds May be Used For:


 Management, Oversight and Coordination

 Travel Costs

 Transportation Costs

 Equipment and Supplies

 HUD-Required Conferences

 Certification and Licensing Costs

# Funds Cannot Pay For:



- Purchase of real property
- Purchase of equipment Over \$10,000 unless approved by HUD
- Medical treatments
- Profit
- Lead hazard evaluation and control activities



# Application Criteria

- ▶ Applicant and Partner Organizational Capacity and Experience (24 Points)
- ▶ Need and Extent of the Problem (20 Points)
- ▶ Soundness of Approach (46 Points)
- ▶ Achieving Results and Project Management (10 Points)
- ▶ Applicants designated as a Minority-Serving Institution (MSI) will receive up to two (2) preference points



## Rating Factor 1 – Applicant and Partner Organizational Capacity and Experience (24 Points)

- ▶ Capability and qualifications of key personnel (8 points)
- ▶ Past performance of the project team in managing similar projects (6 points)
- ▶ Partner capacity (8 points)
- ▶ Environmental Review capacity (2 points)



## Rating Factor 2 – Need and Extent of the Problem (20 Points)

- ▶ Demographic and other data for target area (5 points)
- ▶ Housing data (8 points)
- ▶ Health and other factors demonstrating need (7 points)



## Rating Factor 3 – Soundness of Approach (46 Points)

- ▶ Project Plan (20 points)
- ▶ Recruiting households (2 points)
- ▶ Assessing homes and developing scopes of work (3 points)
- ▶ Describe your plan for contracting for structural interventions (3 points)
- ▶ Referrals for other needs (2 points)





## Rating Factor 3 – Soundness of Approach (46 Points)

- ▶ Evaluating the impact of home interventions (4 points)
- ▶ Building sustainable elements into your program design (4 points)
- ▶ Budget and budget justification (6 points)
- ▶ Section 3 strategy (2 points)





## Rating Factor 4 – Achieving Results and Project Management (10 Points)

- ▶ Project schedule (3 points)
- ▶ Project administration and oversight (5 points)
- ▶ Identify potential obstacles and delays (2 points)





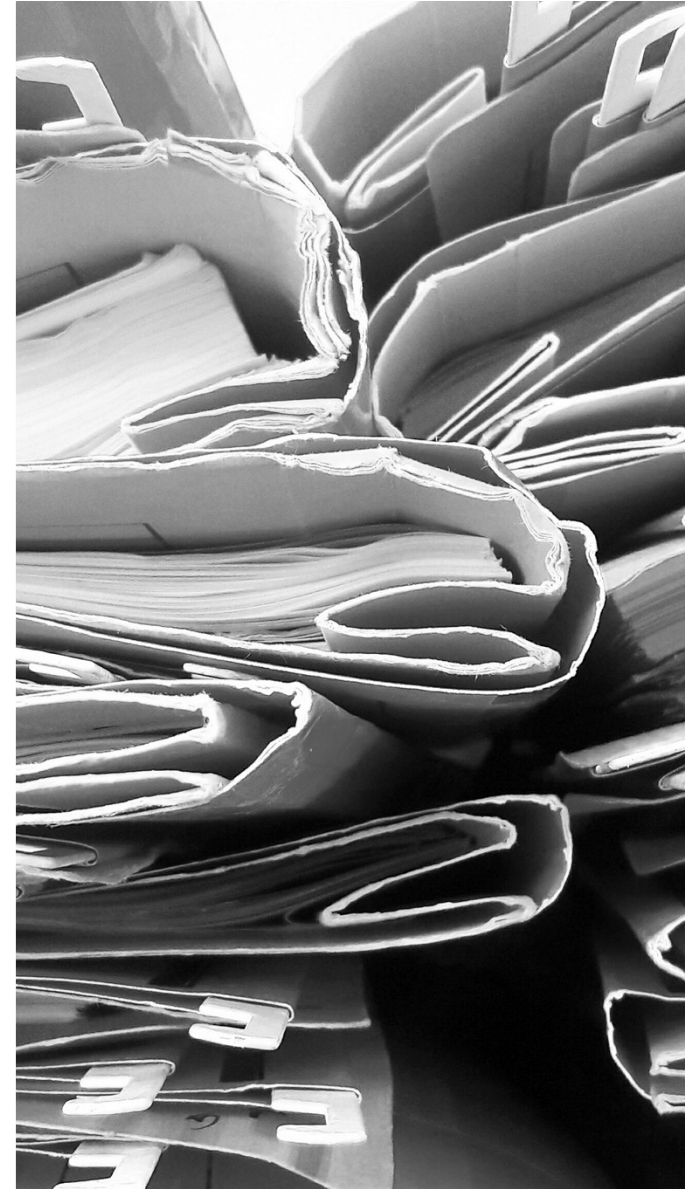
# Application Format and Form

Narratives and other attachments to your application must follow the following format guidelines:

- Up to twenty-five (25) 8-1/2 x 11-inch page limit
- Number the pages of the narrative.
- Minimum 12-point Times New Roman font.
- Minimum margin width of 1-inch on all sides.
- Minimum of single line spacing.

Applicants must not rely on excessive appendices to address the rating factors.

Clearly describe and support all responses within the rating factor narrative itself.
